

Medical Director & Faculty - Michigan Poison & Drug Information Center Department of Emergency Medicine

Wayne State University School of Medicine Department of Emergency Medicine and the Michigan Poison & Drug Information Center are seeking a highly qualified individual to join our team in the position of Medical Director of the Michigan Poison & Drug Information Center (MiPDC). This position is responsible for providing medical oversight of the MiPDC's daily operation and ensures the medical direction given to the public or health care providers is correct and within the existing national standards or expert consensus. The Medical Director must maintain regulatory compliance of the MiPDC with local, state, and federal governing bodies and maintain national accreditation. The Medical Director is also intimately involved in education with the toxicology rotation, the Medical Toxicology fellowship, and Poison Information personnel, and provision of out- and inpatient toxicology evaluation and treatment through the Toxicology service.

Qualified candidates should have a proven track record demonstrating commitment to education, leadership, and scholarship. The candidate must have a degree in medicine (allopathic or osteopathic) with residency in a primary Board-Certified field and fellowship in Medical Toxicology. Poison Center experience is preferred, but not required. Must obtain a registered Michigan license and controlled substance license in the State of Michigan within three months of entry into the job. Applicants must be certified by the American College of Medical Toxicology and the American College of Emergency Physicians or equivalent. Compensation and benefits are highly competitive.
