The Department of Pharmacy Practice at the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center (TTUHSC) Jerry H. Hodge School of Pharmacy is seeking a full-time, non-tenure-track faculty member in the Practice Management Division to serve as Managing Director of the Texas Panhandle Poison Center (TPPC). This unique role offers exceptional opportunities for interprofessional collaboration with the internationally recognized Infant Risk Center and the Texas Tech School of Veterinary Medicine, expanding the reach of innovative One Health patient care.

Based on the Amarillo Campus, TPPC is one of six poison centers in the Texas Poison Center Network and has served the 71-county Texas Panhandle region—covering one-quarter of the state and 1.4 million residents—for over 30 years. The Managing Director will work closely with the Medical Director to provide oversight of clinical toxicology cases, lead poison center staff and programs, ensure accreditation, and oversee initiatives such as the nationally recognized Medication Cleanout™ program.

This position offers substantial administrative support, including a planned assistant director and program coordinator with over 50 years of combined TPPC experience, allowing the Managing Director to focus on strategic leadership and clinical excellence. While effort will be split between faculty and poison center responsibilities, the majority will involve TPPC leadership.

Faculty at TTUHSC benefit from comprehensive mentorship and robust institutional resources to support teaching, scholarship, and service. Our collaborative, division-based structure across four campuses fosters professional growth, interdisciplinary scholarship, and opportunities for innovative patient care. Scholarship is supported through a team-based approach, ensuring new faculty have the tools, partnerships, and guidance needed to thrive.

The ideal candidate will hold a Pharm.D., M.D., or D.O. with experience in acute care medicine or toxicology. Preferred qualifications include ABAT or ACMT certification (or eligibility with completion within two years of hire). Teaching experience is valued, and mentoring is available. Candidates must possess or be eligible for Texas licensure. Academic rank will be commensurate with experience and qualifications.
