



The <u>California Poison Control System (CPCS)</u>, <u>San Francisco Division</u> is seeking a dedicated and dynamic MANAGING DIRECTOR. This full-time leadership position will oversee the performance, quality, and operations of the poison center, including supervising Certified Specialists in Poison Information (CSPIs) and Poison Information Providers (PIPs). The Managing Director, in concert with CPCS leadership and Directors from other CPCS divisions, will provide administrative oversight, ensure compliance with accreditation standards, and lead safe and accurate management of poison center calls and cases.

About CPCS:

The California Poison Control System is a 24/7 toxicology information hotline serving residents across California. As the state's sole poison control center, CPCS is designated by the California Emergency Medical Services Authority and managed by the University of California San Francisco (UCSF) School of Pharmacy, Department of Clinical Pharmacy. CPCS operates from four University of California-affiliated sites:

- UCSF / Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital
- UC Davis Medical Center
- Valley Children's Hospital
- UC San Diego Medical Center

Handling over 250,000 calls annually, CPCS provides poison information to both consumers and healthcare professionals via licensed pharmacists and Poison Information Providers. Services are confidential, supported by a secure medical information system, and accessible in multiple languages through a 24/7 translator service. CPCS also collaborates with volunteer experts in industrial hygiene, environmental health, botany, mycology, and related fields.

Ideal Candidate Qualifications:

- Candidates should possess the following qualifications:
 - O Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) with proven expertise in clinical toxicology and management of poisoned patients.
 - O Licensure: Must possess or be eligible for a pharmacy license in the state of California.
 - Certification or eligibility for certification from the American Board of Applied Toxicology (ABAT) is required.
 Candidates without certification must actively pursue eligibility and complete the necessary exams.
 - Teaching experience is highly preferred.

This is a unique opportunity to serve in a leadership role in the nation's largest poison control system, contribute to public health statewide, and work alongside a team of dedicated toxicologists and healthcare professionals within the University of California system.
