He is Professor of Emergency Medicine at the University of Minnesota Medical School and has been Medical Director of the Minnesota Regional Poison Center since 2011. His work focuses on emergency pharmacology, management of drug-induced shock and delirium, care of patients with substance use disorders in the emergency department, and optimizing care delivered via poison centers.
